Review and reflection of previous spending

Key achievements to date:

In the absence of usual school games mark due to Covid-19 during 2019/2020 and 2020/2021, school awarded a special school games award and virtual games award.

Award of the GOLD School games mark for 2023/2024 was the 5th time the school has been awarded this level of accreditation.

Award of platinum award for P.E and school sports in autumn of 2024 due to level of high school sport and PE and successive successful gold awards.

Award of a 2024 Equality award reflecting high participation of girls in events.

Identified groups including PP, SEND and girls all participating highly in school sport as evidenced in audit of summer 2025.

Sports Council leaders and staff met with headteacher and KS1 staff in 2024 to develop playground markings to support for all staff and monitor and evaluate.

Sports premium is providing quality P.E session for all children with staff having access to weekly CPD to ensure sustainability and quality of P.E and sport provision in school.

Strong outdoor education provision for all children in KS2 including 4 residential opportunities for children in Year3,4,5 and 6 and a 5-week kayaking course for Year 5.

Young people are trained as leaders of sport.

Access to inclusion and SEN events as well as high performing children.

More children involved in extra-curricular sport and representing the school at sporting events.

A strong ethos amongst staff, children and parents of health and well-being.

Quality outdoor education provision for all children in school which supports physical and mental health and well-being.

A well-maintained running path around school leading to an active afternoon daily run and strong running ethos across school.

Both of our climbing areas have been developed alongside the sports council allowing for a sustainable physical climbing space.
