#### Coronavirus




# Merchant Taylors' Masterclass— Monsters & Mythology

# Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

#### How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- · there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

#### How likely are you to catch the virus?

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas

# What should you do if you feel unwell?

If your staff member or parent thinks you have symptoms of coronavirus, they should call NHS 111 for advice. 

#### **Parking Notice**

Towards the end of last year a new pavement was constructed on the sands which was part of the planning requirements.
