Pick up and drop off

A reminder of our pick up and drop off procedures are:

Reception: wait in the designated waiting zone at the front of school and enter through the green gate:

Year 1 & Year 2: children should come with parents to the top black playground ready to line up. Entrance is via the back of school.

Year 3 &Year 4: Children enter via the front of school and should line up on the path.

Year 5 & Year 6: children enter around the running path and are called by staff to line up on the red playground.

School doors will be opened at 8:45 for children to enter. Registration is at 8:55 and all children should be in school by this point. Children are dismissed via the same point they come into school.

All children who enter via the front of school (Year 3, Year 4 and Reception) are asked reminded that NO ONE should be walking across the carpark or waiting in this space. Although the carpark is shut around school entrance and exit times, the carpark is not a waiting area. We also remind all children to wait with a grown up before entering and not to run around and play. The driveway can be used to walk on as the carpark is shut at the start and end of the school day.

We are also reminding all families that it is important to leave the school site as soon as you have collected your children at the end of the day.

Welcome

Welcome to our Summer Term Online Safety Newsletter.

Education for a connected world is becoming more and more important. Children have a right to enjoy being online but as they grow older it is essential they learn how to behave and develop strategies to remain safe online.

As a school and as parents we all need to be on the same page when giving our children the advice and tools to stay safe online.

Digital Well-Being—What is this?

As we approach the long summer holiday its more important than ever that we think about our child's well-being online.

Digital Well-being is about how it makes us feel when using the internet or any forms of technology. This includes the impact it has on our:-

- Emotions
- Mental health
- Physical health

It is important that we recognise how our children are feeling whilst online? How long they spend online? What are the affects it is having on them? Tiredness, not getting outside enough, fresh air, exercise, the content they see etc.

As a school we will be encouraging the children to think about their well-being whilst using technology over the summer holidays. Online Safety is taught to all our children, explaining and demonstrating how to stay safe and behave appropriately online.
